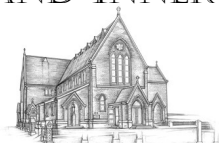

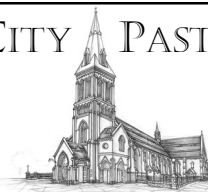

## THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST ~ 3 JUNE 2018

Pope Francis is fond of the analogy of the Church as a hospital, drawing, as others have before him, on Our Lord's words that it is not the healthy, but the sick, who need the doctor. These words, in fact, led many of the early Church Fathers to speak of "Christ the Physician."

If we take the analogy a little further we can recognize the medicinal character of much of what the Church does. In particular, the Sacraments are God's great gift to us, to heal our brokenness. The ordinary means by which God's grace is poured out on us to make us whole.

We see that most clearly, of course, in the Sacrament of Penance, which is why the Holy Father throughout the Year of Mercy, and subsequently, has encouraged us to return frequently to it. But healing is also one of the great gifts that come to us in the Holy Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, in which we particularly rejoice this Sunday.

At the heart of all sin is our choice to separate ourselves from God. In our receiving the Body and Blood of Our Lord, God comes to us, bringing us closer, in the most intimate way possible. God's great call to us is the call to holiness. "Be holy, for I the LORD, am holy. (Leviticus 19:2)" In our continuing struggle with that call the greatest possible help is the holiness of God becoming a part of us. That is the great gift of the Eucharist.

It is strong medicine, too strong for us sometimes. Like powerful healing drugs which sometimes require that the patient be strengthened before they can tolerate them, we sometimes need the healing of Reconciliation before we can approach the Eucharist. But when we do, still recognising

our failure, we should do so trusting that the Lord gave us this gift to make us holy, and will do so, if we give Him the chance.

It is good for all of us to recall one of the prayers which the priest says quietly before receiving Communion himself. "May the receiving of your Body and Blood, Lord Jesus Christ, not bring me to judgment and condemnation, but through your loving mercy be for me protection in mind and body and a healing remedy."
